## Description:

The creative accomplishments of the Andean people of the highland region of South America are prominent among the folk art legacies of the world. This wide-ranging publication, examining over 850 works, is the first to present an overview of the religious, textile, costume, utilitarian, and festival folk arts made in the Andes in the nineteenth and twentieth centuries, after the Andeans were free from Spanish colonial rule. The author offers an understanding of the development of folk art during the colonial period and shows how much of the work produced after independence reflects the interweaving of indigenous craft traditions with European art forms and techniques. Drawing from the renowned collection at the

Museum of International Folk Art in Santa Fe, New Mexico, and other private and public collections in the United States, this book includes religious paintings, sculptures, portable altars, milagros, amulets, and ritual offerings. Traditional hand woven ponchos, mantles, belts, and bags are shown, along with womens skirts, hats, and shawls adapted from the Spanish. Jewelry, wooden trunks, silverwork, majolica ceramics, carved gourds, house blessing ornaments, and toys reveal not only the craftsmanship of the work, but the ways the objects function in everyday life. Also explored are Andean festival cycles with lavish costumes and a variety of masks. With over four hundred color photographs, this monumental book provides a window into the rich spirit and culture of the Andeans.

This remarkable survey of the folk art of the mountainous areas of Bolivia, Ecuador, and Peru was written to serve as the catalogue for a large and impressive exhibition with the same name, which opened at the International Museum of Folk Art in 2011. I had the pleasure of seeing this show soon after it had opened. I recall that there were so many beautiful and interesting objects that the experience was nearly overwhelming. In retrospect, I should have gone back for a series of brief visits, to really take it all in. Because my time in Santa Fe was limited, I only went once, and focused on areas of particular interest. More recently I decided to buy this book. I was pleased and surprised to discover how thoroughly the author had linked succinct factual explanations with vivid color photos of every item. One could revisit the museum after all, from a great distance, by reading this book in comfortable bursts. I have a particular interest in the masks that are used in folk dances in the Americas. When I visited this exhibition, I was pleased to see the variety of masks that were included. These masks only made up a small part of the entire show, but they were of very high quality, well displayed, and otherwise unusual to find in any museum. Now that I have the book, I was interested to find specific and helpful explanations for these masks and their related dances, so that I understood some of them for the first time. Likewise, because I had returned from a visit to Peru with a small collection of animal amulets that were carved from stone, I was very pleased to find several pages of this book where these were illustrated and explained. And so it went. There was such variety! As I rambled through the book I encountered many charming objects, some familiar to me and many others that were unfamiliar. But they did not remain unfamiliar for long, because the information to explain them was precisely adjacent to the images. In summary, I highly recommend this book to anyone with an interest in the folk arts of the Americas. Look, read, and learn.
